Project Description	<p>Druk Green Power Corporation Limited (DGPG), a power generation company owned by Druk Holding and Investments Limited in Bhutan, plans to install decentralized solar power systems using concessional OCR (Ordinary Capital Resources) loans from the Asian Development Bank (ADB).
